### Election Statement

I am standing for election to the RenewableUK Board because the next phase of UK wind's growth will be won - or lost - on delivery, not ambition. The industry already employs over 55,000 people, and RenewableUK and OWIC forecast this could exceed 112,000 by 2030. Ambitious plans exist, but the challenge is turning them into consistent capability on the ground. Workforce expansion at this scale requires aligned training, clear competence standards and operational frameworks that deliver safely and efficiently offshore and onshore.

I bring over 18 years' experience in offshore and onshore wind throughout Europe, APAC and the US, supporting global electrical operations in complex environments where safety, skills and system design directly shape outcomes. I chaired the Wind Operational Safety Rules Group from 2019 to 2024 and was Vice-Chair of its Steering Committee from 2020 to 2024, remaining an active member of both.

In these roles, I helped lead the multi-year development of the Wind Turbine System Safety Rules, uniting OEMs, developers, owners and operators to create a single operational safety framework that works in practice for technicians, engineers and site teams. I gained first-hand experience aligning diverse stakeholders and turning industry ambition into tangible delivery.

I also served on the RenewableUK Shadow Board, contributing to initiatives including RenewableUK NextGen. Alongside my engineering background, I hold an MBA and am committed to building a broader, more diverse and inclusive workforce. If elected, I will bring a practical, collaborative and evidence-led approach, focused on strengthening delivery across the sector."

### Aspiration Statement

Over the next three years, my contribution would focus on helping RenewableUK strengthen delivery across skills, operational safety and capability, building on the strong strategies already in place. Workforce growth on the scale forecast for 2030 will only succeed if planning, training and operational frameworks remain aligned as the industry expands.

First, I would support work that improves consistency across training, competence and role definition for electrical and mechanical disciplines. Skills intelligence has clearly identified pressure points, particularly for technicians, HV specialists and experienced engineers. My focus would be on helping bridge the gap between policy, training provision and operational expectations, so that mobility across projects and employers becomes easier and safer.

Second, I would continue to support the evolution and adoption of operational safety frameworks, including the SafetyOn and G+ Wind Turbine System Safety Rules. Having been closely involved in their development, I understand their importance as living frameworks that must adapt as technology, workforce profiles and asset strategies evolve. Ensuring that feedback from workforce continues to inform improvement will be critical.

Third, I would support RenewableUK's work to broaden and diversify the talent pool, strengthening diversity and inclusion across the sector. Growth at this scale will require attracting people from a wider range of backgrounds and adjacent industries. The sector must remain credible, inclusive and attractive while maintaining high standards.

Across all areas, I would bring a collaborative mindset, a strong understanding of delivery risk and a strategic perspective informed by both engineering practice and business leadership."

**Election Statement**

The renewable sector in the UK is a great success story and has established a world-leading position in offshore wind. We now have a generational opportunity to cement our renewable energy future as a cornerstone of UK industrial strategy and a key driver of economic growth.

As the UK's leading renewables trade association, I believe it is essential that RenewableUK is a strong voice for the supply chain that will deliver these ambitions. It is important that the industry moves beyond policy and politics and focusses on delivery. A strong, capable supply chain will be essential to achieving these targets, in moving development plans into the construction phase and delivering the legacy industry that we all want.

I have worked in the renewables sector for more than 25 years and have extensive experience supporting industry collaboration and best practice through advisory bodies, trade associations and supply chain advocacy. My career has been spent working at the interface between strategy and execution, bringing a practical Tier One contractor perspective on what is needed to deliver projects safely, efficiently and at scale.

If elected, I would be keen to work with members on the following priorities:

- Supporting a steady pipeline of projects that will unlock further investment in the Supply Chain.
- Ensuring that the Supply Chain is heard at the highest level, and that delivery challenges are constructively addressed with Government and developers.
- Driving innovation to strengthen UK competitive advantage, reduce project cost and risk, and support the transition into deeper water.

**Aspiration Statement**

2027 to 2029 looks like it is shaping up to be a particularly difficult period for the global offshore wind supply chain, including the UK with relatively little in construction following the challenges in the US market combined with the failure of auction rounds across Northern Europe. While Auction Round 7 has helped reset the UK market, large-scale construction will only fully accelerate beyond 2029, creating a difficult investment environment in the interim.

Over the next three years, my focus would be on supporting delivery readiness and maintaining confidence across the supply chain during this transition period. This means ensuring a steady pipeline of projects continues to progress towards construction, sustaining capability and investment while protecting the UK's world-leading position in offshore wind.

I believe RenewableUK has a critical role to play in convening industry around these challenges. Through increased engagement with Tier-One contractors and their wider supply chains, the Board can help ensure that delivery constraints, capacity risks and investment pressures are well understood and constructively addressed. By strengthening alignment between developers, contractors and government, we can ensure the supply chain remains resilient and well positioned to deliver the next phase of UK offshore wind growth.

I am standing for election to the RenewableUK Board to continue supporting their vital work in representing and advocating for the sector. My involvement with RenewableUK Future Leaders and the NextGen Network reflects my passion for this. I will use my board position to promote diversity and develop the next generation of renewable leaders with varied backgrounds and perspectives.

I am standing for election to the RenewableUK Board because I believe the next phase of the UK's clean-energy growth demands strong governance, deep sector knowledge, and voices who can confidently advocate for the value our industry brings to the economy and society. ### **Election Statement**

I have just completed a year as a co-opted member of the RenewableUK board during which I have brought to the table my experience of most parts of the energy supply chain. Continuing as a board member will allow me to build on that momentum, highlighting and promoting the UK supply chain, articulating my passion for skills development and job creation, and bringing a broad perspective on the UK energy sector to inform the strategic vision of RenewableUK.

My role and experience is broad. From a renewables perspective it spans fixed and floating offshore wind, onshore wind and associated grid connections. I also have direct and in-depth knowledge of hydrogen, hybrid, steam and gas turbines, as well as the full range of grid technologies and storage. I understand the needs of developers and operators, the grid and the supporting supply chain, and argue for solutions & policies based on those needs.

With over 7,000 people working for Siemens Energy in the UK, we are a significant investor in this country; Siemens Energy is a major part of the supply chain and has a role in most major energy projects, playing a leading part in the clean power transition. ### **Aspiration Statement**

The renewables sector is vital for the UK's energy security and this has been demonstrated in spades during the past few months. Yet debates about the nature and pace of change, as well as the benefits and system requirements continue. The importance of a united front and joined up solutions is greater than ever: the supply chain, including OEMs, and service businesses need a strong voice within RenewableUK. As head of the country's biggest energy supply chain business I feel I'm the right person to represent this part of the industry.

I aim to continue to play a major role in several key debates:

### Aspiration Statement

From day one, my focus would be on helping RenewableUK strengthen its impact as a delivery-focused, credible industry leader at a time when expectations are high and the opportunity for progress is significant. I'd do this in three ways:

**1. Supporting delivery that is credible, inclusive, and grounded in real-world outcomes.** I would help ensure RenewableUK's priorities and activities support members in delivering projects in ways that build confidence with government, communities, and stakeholders. This includes championing approaches that maximise socioeconomic value, strengthen relationships with local communities, and ensure the benefits of renewable energy are felt throughout the development of infrastructure.

**2. Bringing a pragmatic, delivery-led approach to policy leadership.** As the sector moves into its next phase, effective advocacy must balance ambition with realism. I would support strong industry leadership while being willing to challenge and test positions to ensure they are robust, proportionate, and aligned with what will ultimately enable projects to progress. **3. Supporting leadership on asset lifecycle challenges.** As a growing proportion of the UK's renewable assets approach maturity, end-of-life activities and repowering will become increasingly important. I would support RenewableUK in advocating workable, forward-looking policy on repowering, circularity, and decommissioning, helping unlock additional generation while improving environmental and system outcomes. My involvement would be practical, collaborative, and delivery-focused – supporting RenewableUK to remain a trusted, influential voice while helping the sector deliver long-term value for the UK.

### **Election Statement**

Accelerating clean power is essential, not only to cut bills and carbon, but to deliver lasting energy security, independence and the system capacity needed for an electrified, competitive UK economy. Clean Power 2030 is a vital milestone, but our decisions now must enable growth and resilience for decades to come. I believe RenewableUK's Board must help turn member insight into trusted, practical policy delivery. Constructive challenge and collaboration across industry, Government and regulators is critical, and that has been the focus of my career.

Over 20 years in renewables, I have worked across onshore and offshore wind, solar PV and battery storage, helping deliver around 15% of Great Britain's operational onshore wind fleet, from greenfield through commissioning and repowering, and contributed to pioneering projects such as the first utility-scale BESS. This delivery experience anchors my approach to policy and regulation.

Passionate about shaping strategic vision, I have chaired RenewableUK's Grid Group three times, and served on multiple charging, connections and constraints forums. I spent eight years as Vice-Chair and lead generator for the Energy Networks Association's Connections Steering Group, shaping best practice across all UK networks. The UK offshore wind sector is at a critical point. We've built strong momentum over the last decade, but the challenges ahead are increasingly about delivery. Across projects, I'm seeing growing pressure on the supply chain. Capacity, cost, risk, and coordination are becoming critical issues, and they will ultimately determine whether we deliver at the scale the UK is targeting. That's where I believe the board needs to evolve. I bring over 30 years of experience across the energy sector, including more than 25 years delivering complex international EPC projects and the last five focused on renewables and offshore wind. My background spans engineering, procurement, fabrication, and construction, giving me a practical understanding of how projects are delivered in both UK and international markets. I see my role as an integrator. Successful offshore wind projects depend on alignment across developers, OEMs, ports, and the supply chain. That requires system thinking, particularly across multi-contracted projects where delivery risk often sits at the interfaces. I believe this perspective is underrepresented at board level today. Alongside that, I bring a collaborative, solution-oriented approach, a diverse professional network, and a strong focus on delivery. I'm now at a point in my career where I have the capacity to contribute meaningfully, and I'm keen to support a board that reflects the full industry and helps ensure the UK continues to deliver on its offshore wind ambitions.

**Aspiration Statement**

If elected, my focus over the three-year term would be on helping the industry move from ambition to a more mature, delivery-focused energy system. Offshore wind has been a major success story, but the next phase is about building a sustainable long-term industry around a clean, secure, and affordable energy system, not just delivering individual projects. A key priority would be supporting the development of a more joined-up industrial strategy. Each party should take responsibility for the risks they are best placed to manage, supported by greater transparency and more integrated ways of working. My aim would be to help support a more integrated, competitive, and resilient offshore wind sector, one that underpins both the UK's energy system and its industrial future.

By drawing on my background in developing large project pipelines, navigating regulatory frameworks and securing PLC-level approvals, I would help strengthen RenewableUK’s voice on planning, grid connections, flexibility markets and investment signals.

Second, I would focus on supporting the growth of hybrid, integrated and next-generation solutions—from storage and private networks to co-located renewables and industrial decarbonisation projects. I have first-hand experience building new propositions, negotiating major client agreements and removing internal friction to accelerate delivery, and I would bring that same mindset to the Board.

Finally, I would champion member value and collaboration, ensuring that RenewableUK remains a platform where developers, supply chain partners, financiers and emerging innovators can work together on shared challenges.

My commitment is to bring commercial discipline, strategic clarity and industry-wide collaboration to help deliver meaningful progress for members and the UK’s clean-energy transition.
